Little Peter?

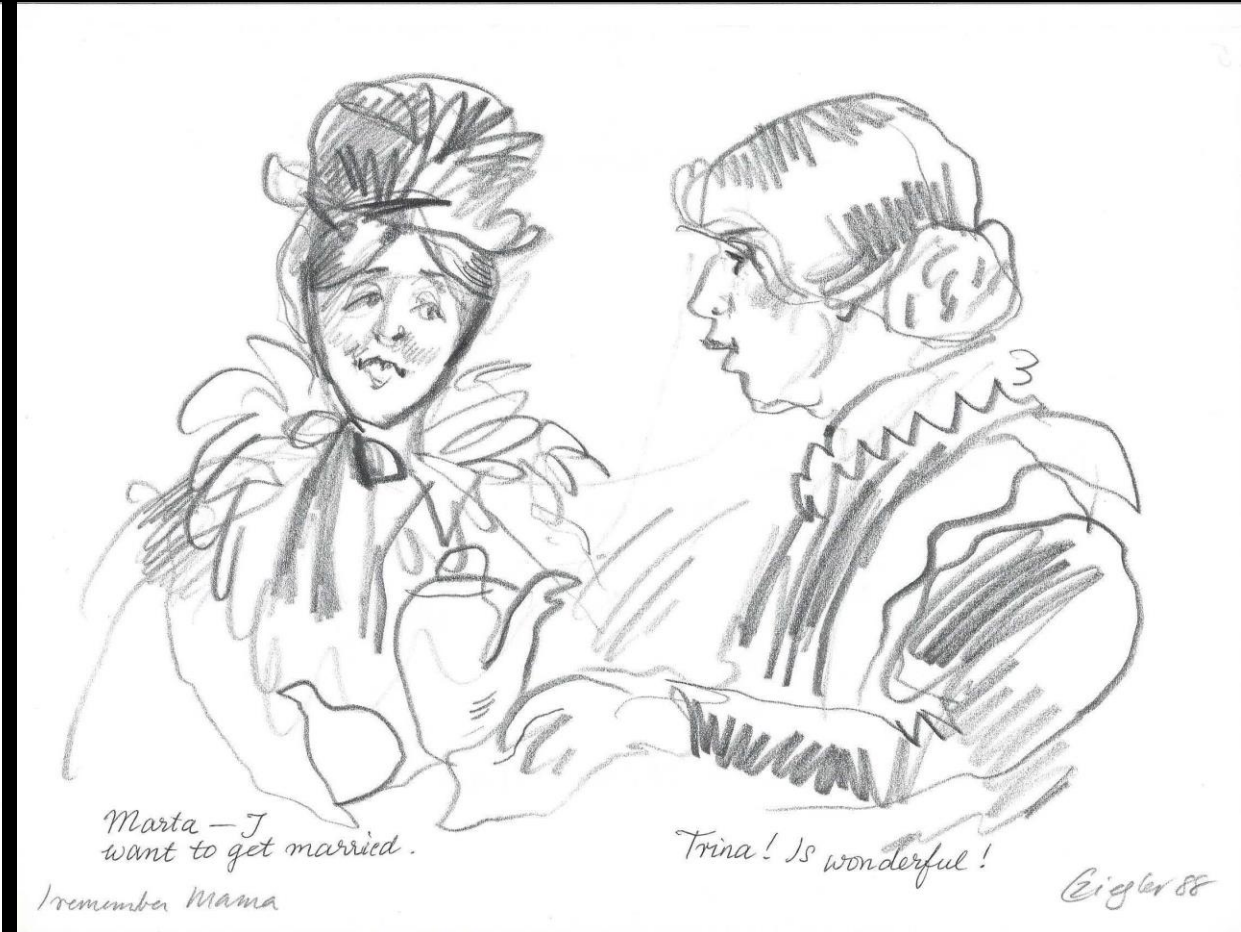
She'd be the laughing stock.
